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
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RECENT UPDATES

We have been working hard on CORE start-up, including establishing an advisory committee and our network of partners. We are also developing a Veteran Economic Security Panel (see Announcements Section) to review future projects. A team focused on outcomes has established sub-committees to identify research gaps, and to develop measurement and data repositories. We have also started an evidence-based practice review of the current employment literature and have begun steps for securing pilot funding for employment/economic security related projects.
